Going Through Changes

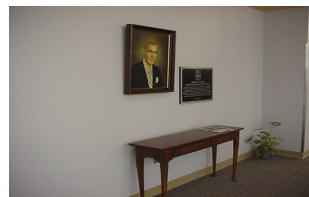

We also have a new name. On June 26, 2005, the LRC was dedicated in honor of Gordon P. Allen. Mr. Allen is a "founding" father of Piedmont Community College. For over 30 years, he has played a major role in the continuing development of PCC.

The new building will provide more space, more computers, and more services. The LRC staff believes that the College community will enjoy the new LRC facility. Our new services include a Business Center,
